You exhibit **the spiritual stability** that comes from knowing Christ, regularly worshipping with His people, and actively pursuing a life of greater devotion, discipline and service.

SM4 Exemplary

You have reached a **high level of maturity** in your Christian faith. You are able to model Christian faithfulness and the spiritual disciplines of a mature disciple. Your life is a good example of authentic Christianity to the unbelievers who know you, and you inspire other believers by your commitment and unselfish Christian service. You can lead by example and guide others in a deeper understanding of what it means to be a "fully-devoted follower" of Jesus Christ.
